## **High Flight**

I am at Vandenberg Air Force Base in California and the activity level is very high because of the Iraqi war. On March 6, they launched a Peace Keeper missile. It was an awesome launch as the missile fired off at 1:29 A.M. on Wednesday, 12 March and boomed south on the range. It went 4,200 miles across the Pacific to Kwajalien Atoll. It carried 8 dummy warheads that were deployed at different times to strike 8 different targets. The mission went very well and, although I did not see the final results, it looked very impressive.

Our base is under siege from the anti-war demonstrators. It is hard to believe for an old veteran that some of our people would try to sabotage the very effort that could save them from terrorists.

There is a new computer system being used now by the military called the Falcon View. It is fantastic and reminds me of Buck Rogers (to you old enough to recall). Each commander is given a hand held computer like a Palm Pilot. It tells him where the enemy is located, their strength and where every friendly unit is. This is updated on a minute-by-minute basis and constantly plots your unit position by GPS technology. If you need help, you program on your hand held and you get air support, artillery or troops as you request.

They also have hand launched models airplanes that have tiny video cameras. The unit is flown towards the front lines and you watch the video display picture as it tells you what the enemy facing you has and where they are located. The model is about the size of a boomerang and is not retrieved after the mission. Until next time keep them flying.

## **Orient Field in Distress**

Just when we thought things were settling down, here comes another problem with flying models. It seems the county commissioners have revised the sound level rules to a maximum of 85db's for any type of sound source for any longer than momentary occurrences. In other words, a motorcycle going by on the highway is OK but not parked and idling for any length of time. What does this mean to the club? In an interview with Prez Bob, he has concluded that only electrics and some low noise four stroke engines will be able to meet the new restrictions thereby making Orient Field essentially an electric only flying site.

The good news is, however, that Bob has found a flying site just off of I-5 near Lebanon where the Portland Area Sailplane Society flies. The site covers nearly 650 acres, has ample parking and no noise restrictions. Admittedly it is a bit of a trip but, like many sites in California, it is only a little under a two hour drive. So, pack your lunch.

Now for more good news, remember that this is the April issue and for all you guys that are ready to give away your glow engines for electric, give me a call, I will be happy to take them off your hands. April F. Doakes and I will see you at the field. *Ed.*
